Course description:

This course offers a study of Chinese literary works written by Chinese Canadian writers. It examines the Chinese diaspora in Canada in relation to social constructions of ethnicity, identity, community, gender and sexuality. It also looks into reflections on the relations of the diasporic community, the homeland and the host country.

At the conclusion of this course, students should be able to do the following:

- ❖ Acquire a basic knowledge of important concepts and ideas in diasporic study;
- Outline the major events in the history of the Chinese in Canada;
- ❖ Identify major Chinese Canadian writers and their works;
- ❖ Acquire essential skills for analyzing literary works.

Method:

Classes usually are composed of a lecture and/or a student presentation, and a discussion session. Discussion will be based on the lecture, presentation, assigned readings, and students' individual research.
