HOW TO APPLY - STEP 1	You must be approved by your home institution to become an exchange student at Huron. Please check your school's website or Student Services Department for information on how to begin the exchange process.
HOW TO APPLY - STEP 2	Once you have been approved by your home institution, you can begin your online application to Huron at Western (found at <a href="https://huronatwestern.ca/incoming-exchange">huronatwestern.ca/incoming-exchange</a> )
HURON CONNECT PORTAL	All students who apply online will be required to set up a <b>Huron Connect Portal</b> account. This will allow students to submit and track their application, along with all required documents.
REQUIRED DOCUMENTS FOR HURON EXCHANGE APPROVAL	<ul> <li>School Nomination</li> <li>Incoming Emergency Contact Form</li> <li>Scanned Passport</li> <li>Copy of Transcript</li> <li>If you are approved by Huron as an Exchange Student, you will then proceed to complete and submit your Incoming Exchange Course Approval Form and Transcript Release Form.</li> </ul>
COURSE INFORMATION	Incoming Exchange students must submit their Course Approval Form 4-6 weeks before arrival. Browse the course information and then contact your department chair at your home institution.  Be sure to search by Campus-Huron: studentservices.uwo.ca/secure/timetables/mastertt/ttindex.cfm
ACCOMMODATION	Accommodation is not guaranteed for incoming exchange students. Students are responsible for determining where they will be living while on exchange. In most cases students will rent or sublet a room or apartment off campus.
PROGRAM FEES	Tuition is paid to your home institution. However, you are responsible for covering living and travel costs. You will also be responsible for paying Exchange program fees (\$1200 - \$1700 CAD).
