This course is to provide students with an integrated framework for preparing, analyzing, and interpreting financial statements. Students will understand why and how accounting principles are used to develop financial statements, learn basic analytical techniques, and gain a better understanding of the workings of an organization. The practical business applications accounting theory will be discussed, along with the methods accounting information is used for business decisions. This course is an integrated introduction to accounting principles and practices.
