Course Description: A review of selected long standing problems in ethical theory, centred on value, choice and character. Topics will include hedonism, issues of summing and ranking goods, akrasia, character and situation, the theory of the Mean, and cynicism and moral skepticism.

Course Goals and Methods: Class participants should become better able to state and discuss some influential theories about the topics studied. The methods of instruction will include readings, lectures, written work and class discussion and debate.
