HOW TO APPLY - STEP 1	You must be approved by your home institution to become an exchange student at Huron. Please check your school's website or Student Services Department for information on how to begin the exchange process.
HOW TO APPLY - STEP 2	Once you have been approved by your home institution, you can begin your online application to Huron at Western (found at huronatwestern.ca/incoming-exchange)
HURON APPLICATION PORTAL	All students who apply online will be required to set up a Huron Application Portal account. This will allow students to submit and track their application, along with all required documents.

COURSE INFORMATION	Incoming Exchange students must submit their Course Approval Form 6-8 weeks before arrival. Browse the course information and then contact your department chair at your home institution.
ACCOMMODATION	Be sure to search by Campus-Huron: studentservices.uwo.ca/secure/timetables/master/ttindex.cfm
APPROXIMATE OFF-CAMPUS LIVING EXPENSES	Accommodation is not guaranteed for incoming exchange students. Students are responsible for determining where they will be living while on exchange. In most cases students will rent or sublet a room or apartment off campus. Contact Huron's Coordinator, International Student Engagement for more information.
VISA NEEDED?	Depending on your citizenship, you may need an eTA or a visitor visa, as well as a study permit: www.cic.gc.ca/english/helpcentre/results-by-topic.asp?st=4.1
STUDY PERMIT?	Foreign nationals need a study permit to study in Canada depending on the length of their exchange: www.canada.ca/en/immigration-refugees-citizenship/services/study-canada/study-permit/eligibility.html

HEALTH INSURANCE	All exchange students are required to have valid health insurance to study in Ontario, Canada. This can be purchased through Huron. huronatwestern.ca/university-health-insurance-plan-uhip
COSTS	Tuition is paid to your home institution. You are responsible for living and travel expenses. You are responsible for other costs you may incur: student union fees, orientation fees, club fees, etc. huronatwestern.ca/student-fees
